DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Working on this play with the actors has deepened our understanding of why *Betrayal* has been acclaimed as Pinter's masterpiece. The language is wonderfully muscular and condensed - like poetry, economic and potent. The embedded meanings and clues folded into each phrase, word, pause, and silence have been a thrilling experience to try to unlock as director and actors, piecing the puzzle together, the play's very human tones and themes revealing themselves in each rehearsal.

The sparseness of Pinter's writing is truly theatrical, and leaves space for interpretation from production to production, and indeed for each audience member to 'join the dots'. Through his masterful writing, the complexities and mysteries of living our lives are profoundly built into the pauses and silences where words can't meet the moment. It asks audiences to concentrate to fully go on that journey.



DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The play's famous reverse chronology, showing the 'anatomy' of the affair from end to beginning, sidesteps any potential for melodrama and allows us to focus on what betrayal means for the three characters portrayed in the piece and, perhaps more importantly, how and why they betray. We see in these human relationships, through the mechanism of the reverse order in the play: who knows what when each character encounters the other, and how each of the characters hide behind their words, how and why they tell lies to each other and themselves, and how they seemingly seek at any cost to avoid real intimacy, confrontation, or change. When we reach the play's end, and the story's beginning, we can reflect on how the lies have spread like sickness and the cost to each character of betrayal – and throughout, enjoy Pinter's wit and humour highlighting the often absurdities of our human behaviour.

Betrayal is considered one of Pinter's more 'accessible' plays. It is, to me, a play about love, at its heart. It is famously based on the playwright's 7 year clandestine affair in the 1960's with English journalist and TV presenter, Joan Bakewell. It is a deeply felt story, brilliantly told, and this has resonated and continues to resonate in productions around the world with its audiences.

Pinter's work, and perhaps *Betrayal* the most, is often concerned with the elusive nature of truth – something we can all definitely relate to today. The unique intimacy of the Old Fitz gives us a magnifying glass as audience members to recognise and examine everyone's 'truths' in the love triangle of this wonderful play.

We hope you enjoy *Sport For Jove's* production of Harold Pinter's *Betrayal*.

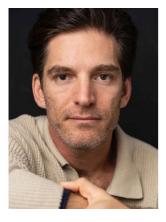


ELLA SCOTT LYNCH

HAROLD PINTER

WRITER

Harold Pinter was born in London in 1930. He lived with Antonia Fraser from 1975 until his death on Christmas Eve 2008. (They were married in 1980).

After studying at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art and the Central School of Speech and Drama, he worked as an actor under the stage name David Baron. Following his success as a playwright, he continued to act under his own name, on stage and screen. He last acted in 2006 when he appeared in Beckett's Krapp's Last Tape at the Royal Court Theatre, directed by Ian Rickson.

He wrote twenty-nine plays including The Birthday Party, The Dumb Waiter, A Slight Ache, The Hothouse, The Caretaker, The Collection, The Lover, The Homecoming, Old Times, No Man's Land, Betrayal, A Kind of Alaska, One For The Road, The New World Order, Moonlight and Ashes to Ashes. Sketches include The Black and White, Request Stop, That's your Trouble, Night, Precisely, Apart From that and the recently rediscovered. Umbrellas.

He directed twenty-seven theatre productions, including James Joyce's *Exiles*, David Mamet's *Oleanna*, seven plays by Simon Gray (one of which was *Butley* in 1971 which he directed the film of three years later) and many of his own plays including his last, *Celebration*, paired with his first, *The Room* at The Almeida Theatre, London in the spring of 2000.

He wrote twenty-one screenplays including *The Pumpkin Eater, The Servant, The Go-Between. The French Lieutenant's Woman* and *Sleuth.*

In 2005 he received the Nobel Prize for Literature. Other awards include the Companion of Honour for services to Literature, the Legion D'Honneur, the European Theatre Prize the Laurence Olivier Award and the Moliere D'Honneur for lifetime achievement. In 1999 he was made a Companion of Literature by the Royal Society of Literature. Harold Pinter was awarded eighteen honorary degrees.

Cristabel Sved has worked professionally as a director, dramaturg, actor, teacher and intimacy co-ordinator.
