DIRECTORS' NOTE

One of the most beautiful ideas in *Bright Star* is that a life isn't fixed; that the story we find ourselves written into can be transformed by sheer will and wild hope. The show asks a big question, quietly: Can the past be rewritten by love and our courage to express it?

Alice Murphy's extraordinary tale - drawn from events that really happened - is at once extremely peculiar, yet (as she tells us, herself) strangely 'familiar' to us all. Set in North Carolina between 1923 and 1946, *Bright Star* is a story of deep healing and reparation - journeying from shame to strength, separation to homecoming, shadow to light. It is an **alchemical story**, where people get pulled apart, reduced to their rawest elements, then slowly, painfully, made whole again.

We have loved breathing life into Steve Martin's whip-smart book and Edie Brickell's soulful score over the past few weeks. At a time when women's rights and voices are being dismantled, and we bear witness to such devastating acts of human violence around the world, our rehearsal room full of banjos, laughter and dancing cellists has felt like an act of defiance and **radical rebellion**; a different vision of how our lives can be.

Bluegrass music, with its rich history of blending African American blues, Scottish-Irish ballads, and frontier spirit, is <u>born of the land</u>, shaped by hardship, kinship, and deep emotional truth. It is the music of gathering on front porches (as our design world suggests) and singing what can't easily be said out loud.

The show demands a great deal of our sixteen-strong cast of storytelling musicians, who are the real **heartbeat** of this production. It has been the greatest honour and <u>marvel</u> to work with such an incredibly talented, feeling, and deeply kind group of actor-musos, led by the fearless Alec Steedman as musical director and radiant Vicky Falconer as music supervisor. We couldn't be prouder of them all.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to <u>every</u> individual who helped us build this rustic, rough magic world from the ground up: Shannon for her spectacular choreography, Isabel for her gorgeous set design, Lily for the delightful costume palette, James for his evocative lighting, Jarrad and MJ for their miraculous sound work, Chris and Isabella for truly tireless producing efforts, Amy and Jemima for brilliant stage management, Laura for her invaluable accent and dialect coaching, the whole Jove team for all the thankless work behind-the-scenes, and of course our friends at the Hayes for giving us this special little home for a month. It takes many hands to make a musical, and this one has been mammoth!

We hope this journey touches you as it does us, and reminds you that even the darkest chapters can yield to grace, love, and joy. While we can't change what's happened, we *can* change how we carry it, and how we move forward together.

MUSICAL DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The lyrics "love let me lift this veil of darkness" are ones that are prominent in my mind when playing this beautiful score. A reminder that although this story delves into the pain and tragedy of life, there is always beauty to be found in the heart and love of those around you. The music of *Bright Star* is vast, sweeping, intricate and ornamental, but more than anything, it is deeply human. Melodies you may have never heard, yet somehow instantly recognise. Lyrics that are both incredibly specific and yet universally understood. That is where the joy in this score comes for me.

As a violinist, the first time I heard the opening refrain of 'Knew My Story', I knew this was a show I wanted to be a part of. On further listening, the lush vocal harmonies, expertly crafted melodic phrases, and dextrous bluegrass refrains only cemented that dream. I am incredibly grateful to Sport For Jove and the Hayes Theatre for making my dreams of bringing this show to life a reality. To Vicky Falconer, my musical supervisor, my mentor, and the best friend I could ask for, thank you for everything you do. You are musical dynamite. To Jarrad and MJ, our sound team. Thank you for making this crazy concept even vaguely possible with your skills.

And finally, I am indebted to this simply astounding cast of actor musicians, who each night, are performing a task so monumental it is hard to put into words. Not only do they act their parts perfectly, they also bring to life the full Broadway arrangements of this very difficult score, whilst dancing, moving, singing, acting, changing set, remembering lines, and beautifully conveying the emotional heart of a deeply complex and personal story in front of our eyes. They are simply world class. The show would not exist without them, and I am eternally grateful for their talents, time, dedication and sheer musicianship.

In truth, musically directing this show has been a dream, I have simply brought incredibly talented people into a room and let them do what they do best. Make music. It's been a highlight of my career so far.

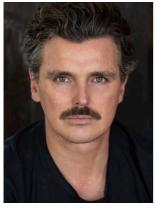

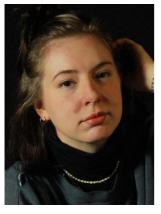
